	b. What did you previously learn about Priscilla and Aquila (Acts 18:1-21)? What does this passage add to your knowledge of them? What do you learn about them in Rom 16:3; 1 Cor 16:9; and 2 Tim 4:19?		
	c. We are going to hear a lot about the Ephesian church in the coming section of Acts. What do you learn about the Ephesian church in this passage?		
4.	Is time or place significant in the events that happen?  a. What do you know, if at all, about Alexandria, Ephesus, and Achaia (i.e. south/central Greece)?		
	b. Where was Paul during this time? What reasons might Luke have had to take this detour from Paul's ministry, to highlight Priscilla, Aquila and especially Apollos?

9.	Consider the words and themes of this passage with Apollos, a disciple of John the Baptist (Acts 18:24-28), over against the disciples of John the Baptist in Ephesus (Acts 19:1-7). What do the similarities and differences teach?		
10.	What does the passage reveal about who Jesus is, and what he came into the world to do?		
11.	What is meant by "the way"? Consider also Acts 9:2; 16:17; 18:25, 26; 19:9, 23; 22:4; 24:14, 22		
12.	How could you sum up the meaning of this passage in your own words?

13.	What biblical convictions do you hold with a closed fist? That is, these are convictions that you are rock ribbed about, won't budge an inch, hold to firmly, and treasure deeply. What convictions do you hold with an open palm? That is, these are areas of belief where Christians differ in perspective, or where you have lots of questions about what the Bible teaches.		
14.	Priscilla joined her husband Aquila in explaining to Apollos the way of God more accurately. How do egalitarians understand the implications of this? How do complementarians understand this?		
15.	In this season of our church, in what ways are you encouraged by the ministry of the Word amongst us?		
16.	Peter (1 Pt 4:10-11) distinguishes between "whoever speaks" and "whoever serves". While these are not mutually exclusive, what is your sense that you have gifts that lean towards speaking or towards serving?		
17.	Where do you see opportunities in our church for more laborers of the Word? What qualities should fellow-laborers of the Word possess?
