Our Call to praise!

Vs.1—Praise the LORD!

We praise him because He is present, powerful, and holy!

Praise God *in* his sanctuary; praise him *in* his mighty heavens!

We praise Him because He’s never limited or outmatched – ever!

Praise the LORD! Praise God *in his sanctuary*; praise him *in his mighty heavens!*

We praise Him *for* His mighty deeds!

Vs. 2—Praise him *for* his mighty deeds; praise him *according* to his excellent greatness!

We praise Him *with* skill and exuberance!

Vs. 3—Praise him *with* trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp!

Vs. 4—Praise him *with* tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe!

Vs. 5—Praise him *with* sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals!

Vs. 6—Let everything that has breath praise the LORD!

"How does this passage intend to change my mouth?"

"What is this passage telling me to do?"

"How does this passage speak to the work of Christ on the cross?"

"What does Jesus' death for my sins have to say about this passage?"

"How does this passage reflect the truth of Christ's resurrection?"

"How does the fact that Jesus is the risen, ascended, reigning, and soon to return king of the universe effect this passage and how I apply it?"
